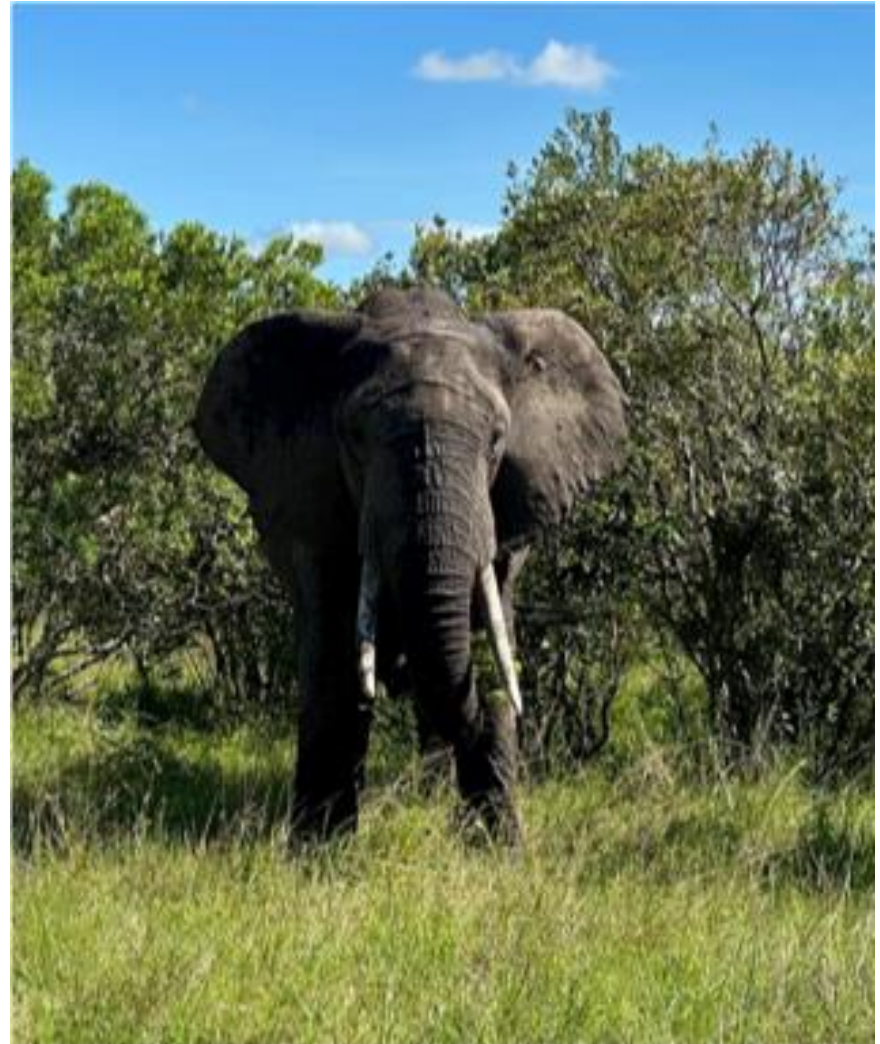

What is peer-to-peer learning?

- Peer-to-peer learning can:
 - provide an effective way of sharing of good practices, knowledge, expertise, technologies, innovative solutions, and resources, that benefit all involved parties.
 - Connect countries that face common challenges and share similar characteristics (e.g. economic and social conditions and language), making the exchanges more relevant and adaptable
 - Strengthen South-South collaboration, in line with GBF Target 20 and COP Decision 15/8 on capacity building and development and technical and scientific cooperation

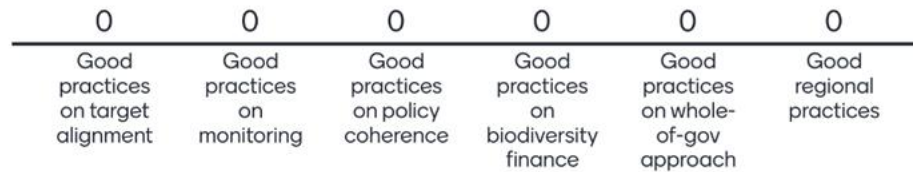

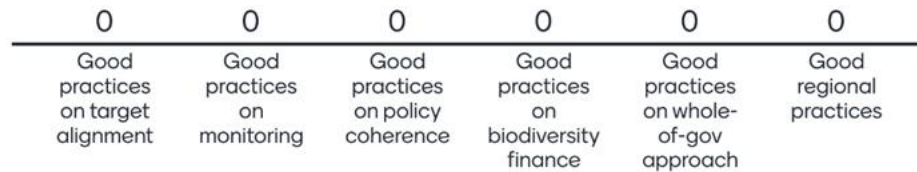
