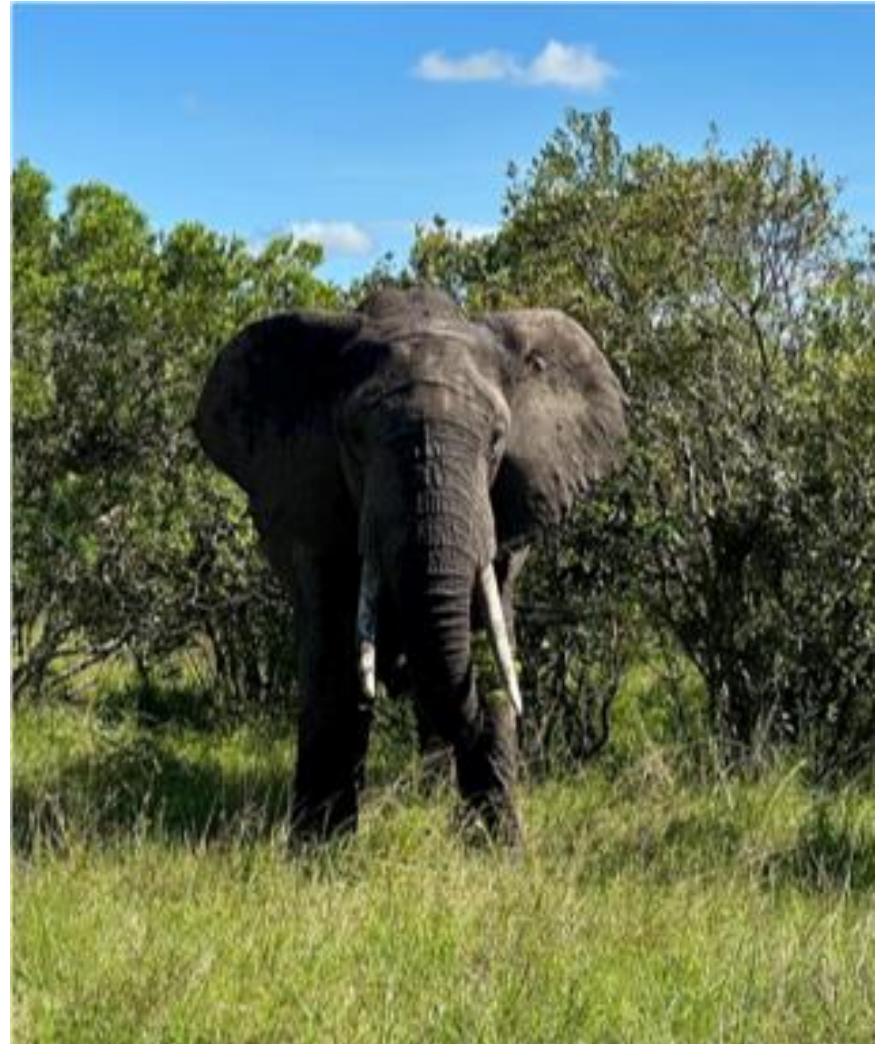

What is peer-to-peer learning?

- Peer-to-peer learning can:
 - Provide an effective way of sharing of good practices, knowledge, expertise, technologies, innovative solutions, and resources, that benefit all involved parties.
 - Connect countries that face similar challenges and share similar characteristics (e.g. economic and social conditions and language), making the exchanges more relevant and adaptable
 - Strengthen South-South collaboration, in line with COP Decision 15/8 on capacity building and Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (Target 20)

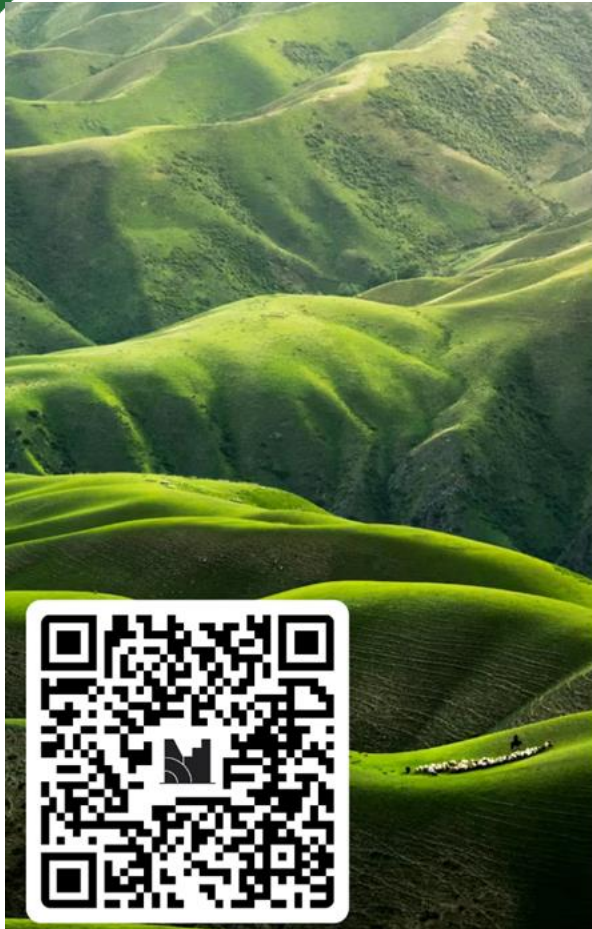


Types of peer-to-peer learning that we are exploring

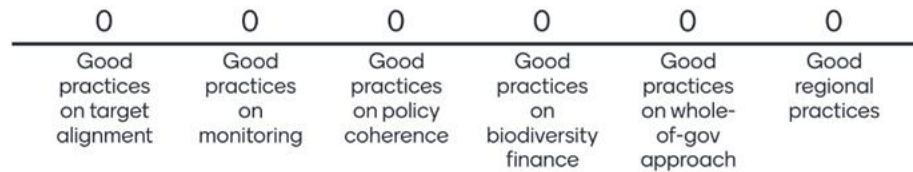
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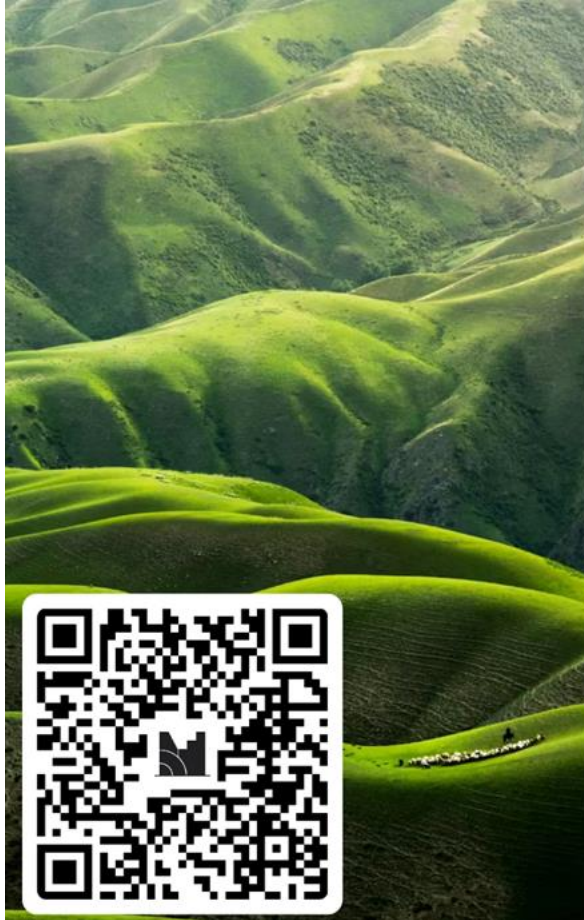

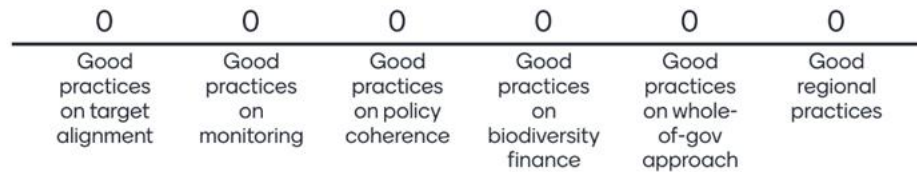
